Beach Wheelchairs are coming to Sunderland!

The Forum formed a partnership/steering group with Headway Wearside, St Peter's Cycle and Sports Hub and Steve Wilkinson a local wheelchair user to advance the project. We contacted the charity Beach Access North East (BANE) who very kindly gave us lots of advice and we met with officials from Sunderland Local authority. We are delighted to say the result of all this work is an award of £24,975 from Sunderland City Council Community Fund via the North Area Committee. Work was due to start this month but may be delayed because of lockdown 2 but the partnership steering group is confident that the service will be up and running early next year. Watch this space!
